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The path linking disease severity and cognitive function with quality of life in Parkinson's disease: the mediating effect of activities of daily living and depression

Abstract

Background: Research on quality of life (QOL) with Parkinson's disease (PD) has examined direct influencing factors, not mediators. The study aim was to explore whether PD severity and poor cognitive function may decrease physical and mental QOL by reducing activities of daily living (ADL) and increasing depression in sequence.

Methods: We conducted a cross-sectional questionnaire study of 150 PD hospital patients in China. PD severity, cognitive function, ADL, depression, and QOL were evaluated. We used structural equation modeling to analyze the mediating effects of ADL and depression on the association between PD severity/cognition and the physical health and mental health component summary scores measured by the SF36 quality of life instrument.

Results: There was a significant mediating effect of PD severity on physical health via ADL and depression (95% CI: -0.669, -0.026), and a significant direct effect ($p < 0.001$). The mediating effect of PD severity on mental health via ADL and depression was significant (95% CI: -2.135, -0.726), but there was no direct effect ($p = 0.548$). There was a significant mediating effect of cognitive function on physical health via ADL and depression (95% CI: 0.025, 0.219) and a significant direct effect ($p < 0.001$). The mediating effect of cognitive function on mental health via ADL and depression was significant (95% CI: 0.256, 0.645), but there was no direct effect ($p = 0.313$). The physical health models showed a partial mediation, and the mental health models showed a complete mediation, of ADL and depression.

Conclusions: PD severity and cognitive function increase depression by reducing ADL, leading to lower QOL, and directly or indirectly affect physical health and mental health through different pathways.

Introduction

Parkinson's disease (PD) is a chronic progressive neurodegenerative disorder that affects middle-aged and older people [1]. Non-motor PD symptoms, such as cognitive impairment and depression, have attracted increasing attention and may exacerbate disability, affect quality of life (QOL), and shorten life expectancy [2]. The American economist Galbraith first proposed the concept of QOL in 1958 and it has been widely used

easier for physicians to treat the physical aspects of these diseases. However, it is becoming increasingly evident that more than just the physical symptoms need to be treated in order to improve overall quality of life (QoL) among PD and APD patients. This study assesses the key factors that influence health-related QoL for both PD and APD patients and compares across the two disease groups as well as among the APD group. Three hundred and fifty-three patients were used in this study and diagnosed with having PD (187), PSP (50), MSA (65), DLB (34), or CBD (17). Each patient completed the short form 12 (SF-12), Beck's Depression Inventory (BDI), Unified Parkinson's Disease Rating Scale (UPDRS), Mini-Mental State Examination (MMSE), Schwab and England SE, and the Hoehn and Yahr rating scale (HY), which measured for QoL, depression, mood, behavior, motor functioning, activities of daily living, cognitive function, and disease severity. We also looked at age and gender identification. After analyzing the results, APD patients were found to have overall lower health-related QoL than PD patients in earlier age groups. When comparing SF-12 PCS scores, MCS scores between PD and APD were not significantly different. In addition, no significant differences were found between SF-12 scores when comparing PSP, MSA, CBD, and DLB. Depression was found to be the main determinant of health-related QoL among all disease groups and was a stronger predictor of QoL for PD than APD. Mood, behavior, and mentation were predictors of QoL for PD and DLB. Motor functioning, age, and gender were significant determinants of QoL only for PD, while disease severity was a determining factor for MSA and CBD patients. In addition, activities of daily living was a predictor of QoL for PD, DLB, and PSP. This study shows that various factors affect health-related QoL differently among different disease groups and should be taken into consideration by physicians in order to provide the best medical care possible.

Quality of Life and Caregiver Burden in Parkinson's Disease

Many psychosocial factors have been shown to be associated with quality of life; however, there has been limited research investigating the role of illness appraisals despite this existing for other chronic health conditions. Negative consequences to caring were evident with social restrictions and loss of previous identities and a shared future identified. However, a sense of resilience emanated throughout the studies. Ambivalence was an emergent theme with spouses reporting a need for increased professional support but stated difficulties discussing issues, particularly those regarding end of life. Increased community support and resource is required with a dyadic focus including both spouse and patient. The empirical study focussed on quality of life and caregiver burden in Parkinson's disease and the role of patients' and carers' illness appraisals. A cross-sectional self-report design was utilised. Illness appraisals were demonstrated to be key predictors of quality of life and burden after controlling for biomedical variables, and the importance of consideration of both patient and carer appraisals for these outcome measures was highlighted. Clinical implications of the findings are discussed with suggestions for future research. The critical appraisal

Results revealed meaningful, significant predictive relationships when considering severity of motor symptoms and communication participation. Overall, these results indicate a combination of speech and motor deficits may be the best predictor of overall quality of life.

Social Behavior, Gender, and Quality of Life in Parkinson's Disease Pai-Chuan Huang, 2009. Abstract: Recent studies have found that women and men have different experiences living with Parkinson's disease PD and create different impressions when they have reduced facial expressivity. Previous research also suggests that reduced facial expressiveness called facial masking is a common symptom in people with PD. Because social relations typically are facilitated through facial expressiveness, masking may create negative interpersonal impressions. This study examined the questions: 1. Are there gender differences in quality of life in people with PD? 2. Are there associations between facial expressiveness and capacity to show rapport in people with PD? 3. Are there associations between social behavior, facial expressiveness, and rapport and social well-being? 4. Is there a moderating role of gender? Videotaped interview and data of 104 participants (31 women) were analyzed. Our findings showed that women reported more problems in stigmatization and men reported more problems in activities of daily life. Both women and men who showed less facial expressiveness were less likely to show rapport during the interview. Women's higher levels of facial expressivity and rapport behavior would occur with fewer problems in social support and communication. These associations remained significant after controlling for covariates including age, living status, marital status, PD duration, PD stage, cognitive status, depression symptoms, and extraversion. The magnitudes of zero-order correlations were generally greater in women compared to men. However, the gender differences that existed in zero-order correlations were not supported when controlling for the covariates. The findings demonstrate the need to broaden our knowledge on how certain symptoms may relate to people's social roles. The possible moderation of gender should be explored in future studies. Health care providers should be aware of the potential relationship between facial expressiveness and rapport and the implications for family.
