Baroque: c. 1600-1750

Classical: c. 1750-1800

Baroque music is detailed and very organized and includes both rather highly decorated and elegant like Johann Sebastian and Bach's compositional style, but it became the first phase of the classical period as orderly, balanced and clear

Baroque music was more ornate, primarily composed with a more complicated structure, often gave experimentally with instruments, while Classical Baroque (during 18th century) provided a more natural, simpler structure
