Objective:

To introduce children to basic drama skills, enhance their creativity, and encourage teamwork through fun and engaging activities.

Materials Needed:

- Open space for movement
- Music player and optional music
- Props (optional)
- Whiteboard and markers

Class Structure:

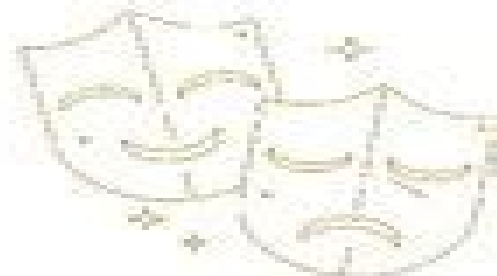
Introduction (5 minutes):

- Welcome the children and celebrate the first anniversary of the class.
- Briefly explain what drama is and how it involves storytelling, emotions, and
- teamwork. Icebreaker: Have each child share their favourite story or character.

Warm-Up Activity (5 minutes):

- Play a game called "Zip, Zap, Zop." Stand in a circle and pass energy (Zip, Zap, Zop) around by pointing and saying the corresponding word. If someone makes a mistake, they are out until the next round.

Marriott,2017 This project explored the intersection between theater literacy and digital media literacy in order to create a unit for the middle school classroom The unit plan was designed to teach digital media literacy using a drama curriculum drawn from the Utah State Theater Core Utah State Board of Education 2016 in the secondary classroom There were two parts to this integration The first was to have students examine online media in order to analyze and evaluate digital media from a performance perspective The second was to create a performance piece using digital media Performance studies was the theatrical technique used to examine digital media The objectives of this project were to create a unit plan and accompanying lesson plans for teaching digital literacy in a middle school drama class that focused on 1 The navigation of the intersection between theater literacy and digital media literacy to help students think more critically about their digital media use 2 Authentic applications of media literacy in real world situations to help students better understand the world they live in and make more educated decisions about their media consumption 3 The application of theater techniques to interpret digital media as performance and the expansion of the students digital media literacy skills The unit plan was implemented with some success though there were several problems The students had mixed reactions to the unit but overall enjoyed learning something new and having choice as to the message they were asked to create **English/language Arts**
