waxing gibbous: when more than half of the moon is lit and it's getting bigger.



full moon: when the entire moon is lit by the sun.



waning gibbous: when more than half of the moon is lit and it's getting smaller.



third quarter: when half of the moon is lit and it's getting smaller.



waning crescent: the moon looks like a crescent and it's getting smaller in size.
