In early 2021, 22 the Flexible Phonics reading intervention a large scale randomised controlled trial took place in 118 schools in England and involved nearly 3 000 children. This study aimed to provide valuable insights into the success of largely school based education trials. The Flexible Phonics trial proved to be not only an important experiment in improving children's literacy but a case study in which the methodology of single randomised controlled trials in education can be considered. Reading Randomised Controlled Trials investigates the complexities of conducting randomised controlled trials in the field of education and how they can be seen as a cultural activity. Research into reading development and reading disabilities has been dominated by phonologically guided theories for several decades.
