The PQRST method is a systematic approach to pain assessment that helps healthcare providers gather detailed information about a patient's pain experience. Here's a summary of what each letter stands for:

P**PROVOCATION**

What triggers the pain or makes it better?

Q**QUALITY**

What does the pain feel like (e.g., sharp, dull, throbbing)?

R**REGION**

Where is the pain located? Does it spread?

S**SEVERITY**

How intense is the pain, typically rated on a scale from 0-10?

T**TIMING**

When does the pain occur, and how long does it last?
