- *How To Develop -* **Heavy Work**

Background: Heavy work is when children move through
activities that challenge the proprioception system. Proprioception is the
body's proprioceptors (sensory receptors) that detect movement and position.

Heavy work allows children to move through their body in a more
engaged manner to develop increased proprioception through touch and movement.

Heavy Work Activities:

- Climbing on playground
- Climbing trees, climbing ladders
- Heavy object transfers
- Pulling or pushing heavy objects (e.g. bags)
- Pushing heavy objects (e.g. tricycles)
- Heavy jumps
- Heavy bearhugs
- Heavy bearhugs (e.g. pushing chair)
- Pushing or pulling heavy objects

- *How To Develop -* **Circular Motor Skills**

Background: Circular motion is the use of the body's circular
proprioceptors. These are engaged in more voluntary movements
such as rolling.

As children learn to roll, crawl, walk, and run, they develop circular
proprioception. These skills are important for many things such as handwriting, jumping rope, climbing, and more. Circular motion is often
described as a "wavy" movement.

Activities for Developing Circular Motion Skills:

- Rolling on playground (e.g. rolling down a hill, rolling a ball, rolling a chair)
- Rolling a ball (e.g. rolling a ball around a circle, rolling a ball back and forth)
