

Bipolar Disorder Nursing Care Plan

Definition

Bipolar Disorder is a chronic mental health condition characterized by extreme mood swings that include emotional highs (mania or hypomania) and lows (depression), affecting a person's energy, activity levels, and ability to function.

Nursing Diagnosis

Risk for Injury related to impaired judgment during manic episodes as evidenced by increased psychomotor activity and engaging in high-risk behaviors.

Risk Factors/Causes

- Genetic predisposition and family history
- Chemical imbalances in the brain
- Environmental stressors and trauma
- Sleep disturbances and circadian rhythm disruption

Nursing Interventions and Rationales:

Monitor medication compliance and assess for side effects

- Rationale: Ensures therapeutic effectiveness of mood stabilizers and early detection of adverse reactions

Establish and maintain consistent daily routines

- Rationale: Helps stabilize circadian rhythms and provides structure that can prevent mood episodes

Assess for suicidal ideation and safety risks regularly

- Rationale: Enables early intervention during depressive episodes and prevents self-harm behaviors

Provide education about triggers and early warning signs

- Rationale: Empowers patient to recognize and respond to mood changes before they become severe

Desired Outcomes:

Patient will maintain stable mood and demonstrate effective management of symptoms through medication compliance, healthy coping strategies, and appropriate use of support systems within 30 days.
