Mr. Jones is a 35 year old male who appears older than his stated age. He is separated from his spouse.

His dress was disheveled with dirty t-shirt, ripped jeans, and shoes with holes in them. His grooming and hygiene were inadequate. He was resistant to the interview. His posture was slumped, mood was angry, affect was flat, rate of speech was slowed, tone was soft. His thought processes were incoherent. He did not demonstrate appropriate insight. His thought content was delusional and he demonstrated psychotic symptoms. He did not deny auditory hallucinations. He denied obsessions and compulsions and he denied phobias. He was not oriented to time, place, and person. His memory was impaired, intelligence was estimated to be above average, judgment and impulse control were inadequate. He denied suicidal and homicidal ideations.
