

HEAD-TO-TOE ASSESSMENT

General Survey

- Mental status
- Body temperature
- Respiratory status
- Mobility

Vital Signs:

- Temperature
- Pulse
- Respirations

Head and Face:

- EYES:
 - Assess for epiphora and proptosis (bulging eyes).
 - Assess for conjunctivitis, lacrimation, and redness.
- FACE:
 - Assess facial symmetry and expression.
 - Assess for rash, rashes, and facial palsy (drooping eyelid or flat nose).

Neck:

- LYMPH NODES:
 - Assess lymph nodes near and along the neck for enlarged nodes.
- THROAT:
 - Assess other structures present in posterior pharynx (tonsils, lymphoid tissue) for any enlargement or changes.
- TRACHEA:
 - Assess for trachea with no masses.

Eyes:

- Assess orientation by asking patient to point both eyes to the same direction.
- RETINA: Assess color, liquid, visual acuity, eye, and accommodative.
- Assess any conjunctival discharge or edema.

Ears:

- Assess for pain, discharge, and drainage, and discharge.
- Assess respiratory status of patient and audiometric results.

Nose:

- Assess for rhinitis, epistaxis, and discharge.
- Assess respiratory status of patient and tone.

Mouth:

- Lips: Assess for color, moist and dryness.
- Gums: Assess edema, bleeding, and color.
- Tongue: Assess for color and texture.

Throat:

- Voice: Assess for pitch, volume, and quality.
- Palate: Assess for the normal color of the surrounding areas.

Lungs and Heart:



- Chest: Assess for tenderness, rales, and hyperresonance.
- Assess skin surface for rashes and lesions.
- Palpate heart and liver with pads.
- Auscultate lung sounds on both the anterior and posterior sides of patient's chest.

Abdomen:

- Assess right upper quadrant.
- Assess right lower quadrant.
- Assess left upper quadrant.
- Assess left lower quadrant.
- Assess mid-abdomen.
- Assess right hypochondriac region.



Abdomen:

- Assess abdomen for symmetry.
- Auscultate bowel sounds in all 4 quadrants.
- Palpate all 4 quadrants.
- Assess all 4 quadrants and rectum for normal palpation.

Skull:

- Assess skin color, texture, temperature, and presence of lesions.
- Assess bone, periosteum, cartilage, and cartilage of head.
- Assess dentition and alignment of teeth.

Peripheral Arteries:

- Assess peripheral limb integrity of pulses.
- Assess for presence of pulses.

Capillary Refill Time:

- 1-2 sec: normal, peripheral pulses
- 3-5 sec: delayed, peripheral > 5 seconds
- 6-10 sec: delayed, peripheral 6-10 seconds
- 11-15 sec: delayed, peripheral > 15 seconds
