It is neonatal intensive care unit also you may hear the NICU called:

- a special care nursery
- an intensive care nursery
- a newborn intensive care nursery

What does neonatal mean?

- Neonatal period is the first month after a baby is born there are also neonatal disorders that require a neonatal care as in NICU

## Levels of NICU Care

1

### Newborn Nursery

Cares for healthy, full-term babies, basic medical care, feeding support, routine newborn checkups.

3

### Neonatal Intensive Care

Identify and clearly define the problem you are trying to solve. Understand the needs of the stakeholders and the end-users.

2

### Special Care Nursery

Babies born prematurely (typically 32+ weeks). Offers specialized monitoring.

4

### Advanced NICU - Highest Level of Care

Identify and clearly define the problem you are trying to solve. Understand the needs of the stakeholders and the end-users.

### Time Management

Take It Hour by Hour:

Avoid feeling overwhelmed by focusing on one hour at a time.

Recognize that some tasks may be passed to the next shift if needed.



### Patient's Code Status

**Do Not Intubate (DNI)**  
The patient wants CPR but not intubation.



Why the baby may be admitted to the neonatal unit ?!

Babies are admitted to the neonatal unit for a number of reasons. Such as

1- **preterm birth** and **term babies** who are **unwell** or need **medical or surgical investigations or treatments**. If the baby is born **before 35 weeks** gestation, and/or his birth weight was **1500 gm**, they will usually be admitted to the neonatal

2- **Breathing issues** Respiratory problems are common in newborns, particularly those born prematurely. Two primary breathing issues that may necessitate a NICU stay include:

- **Respiratory distress syndrome**: Often seen in premature babies, this occurs when the lungs are not fully developed and lack surfactant, which helps keep the air sacs open.
- **Transient tachypnea of the newborn** is characterized by rapid breathing and typically resolves within a few days as the baby's lungs clear excess fluid.

3- Problems regulating blood sugar **Low blood sugar, or hypoglycemia**, can be a concern for newborns, especially those who are premature or whose mothers have diabetes or gestational diabetes. Babies with hypoglycemia may need close monitoring and treatment to ensure their blood sugar levels remain stable.
