Air War Over North Vietnam Stephen Emerson, 2018-02-28 In early 1965 the United States unleashed the largest sustained aerial bombing campaign since World War II against North Vietnam Through an ever escalating onslaught of destruction Operation Rolling Thunder intended to signal Americas unwavering commitment to its South Vietnamese ally in the face of continued North Vietnamese aggression break Hanoi political will to prosecute the war and bring about a negotiated settlement to the conflict It was not to be Against the backdrop of the Cold War and fears of widening the conflict into a global confrontation Washington policy makers micromanaged and mismanaged the air campaign and increasingly muddled strategic objectives and operational methods that ultimately sowed the seeds of failure despite the heroic sacrifices by U S Air Force and Navy pilots and crews Despite flying some 306 000 combat sorties and dropping 864 000 tons of ordnance on North Vietnam 42 per cent more than that used in the Pacific theater during World War II Operation Rolling Thunder failed to drive Hanoi decisively to the negotiating table and end the war That would take another four years and another air campaign But by building on the hard earned political and military lessons of the past the Nixon Administration and American military commanders would get another chance to prove themselves when they implemented operations Linebacker I and II in May and December 1972 And this time the results would be vastly different

Operation Rolling Thunder Vance Ferton, The conception of Operation Rolling Thunder in the early months of 1965 represented the culmination of strategic thinking that viewed air power as a precise instrument of political persuasion rather than merely a tool of military destruction embodying the belief that carefully calibrated bombing campaigns could convince North Vietnam to abandon its support for insurgency in South Vietnam without provoking the kind of massive retaliation that might escalate into global conflict This doctrine of graduated pressure reflected the influence of nuclear strategy theorists who had developed concepts of controlled escalation during the Cold War adapted now to conventional warfare in Southeast Asia where American policymakers believed they could fine tune military pressure to achieve specific political objectives The strategic architects of Rolling Thunder including Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara and his team of systems analysts approached the bombing campaign with the confidence that modern management techniques and technological superiority could solve the political problems of Vietnam through the systematic application of carefully measured force The political context that gave birth to Rolling Thunder was shaped by the deteriorating situation in South Vietnam during 1964 and early 1965 as the government of South Vietnam teetered on the brink of collapse while Viet Cong forces gained strength and territory throughout the countryside President Lyndon Johnson faced mounting pressure from military advisors and congressional hawks who argued that only decisive military action could prevent communist victory in Southeast Asia while also confronting domestic political considerations that made massive ground force deployment politically risky The air campaign represented an attractive middle course that could demonstrate American resolve and commitment while avoiding

the domestic political costs associated with large scale ground combat operations that might produce heavy American casualties

Naval Academy,2014-04-19 The assassination of South Vietnamese President Ngo Dinh Diem on November 1 1963 left a leadership void in Saigon that was never filled Heads of state went through Saigon like a revolving door yet none of them were able to successfully lead and govern the people of South Vietnam On the other side of the globe President of the United States John F Kennedy was assassinated on November 22 1963 While the U S had a line of succession President Johnson was relatively new to the Vietnam situation Even though Johnson was new he still had Kennedy s cabinet and advisers to aid his decisions Despite this by early 1964 two new leaders Nguyen Khanh and Lyndon Johnson sought a solution to the decades long struggle in Vietnam President Johnson inherited a three front war in Vietnam One front was North Vietnamese support of the Viet Cong VC insurgency in South Vietnam and Johnson had to stop this support in order to defeat the VC The insurgency itself constituted another front that had to be defeated in order to maintain a free and independent South Vietnam The third overarching front was the creation of a stable and legitimate government in Saigon capable of governing the people of South Vietnam The question for his administration was on which of these aspects to focus Before Johnson could make that decision he first had to decide if the U S should continue to aid Saigon therefore he had three options leave Vietnam continue in an advisory role or escalate U S involvement The political and military situations in Vietnam deteriorated to such a point through 1964 1965 that by February 1965 there were no good choices left from which President Johnson could choose Johnson desired for there to be a stable South Vietnamese government before he committed

U S forces to its defense however no such government emerged The administration was unwilling to risk U S prestige resources and lives unless they were confident South Vietnam could succeed without U S support Because of the instability in South Vietnam as well as the perceived risk of communist aggression President Johnson decided that escalatory military actions would be limited and gradual Therefore President Johnson made the least bad decision he could in February 1965 by initiating Operation ROLLING THUNDER and committing the United States to the Vietnam War Naval Air War U.
