Nursing Ethics In Everyday Practice

Ethical conflicts are a part of everyday practice in nursing care. Nurses, as the most trusted profession, strive to provide holistic care. Whether in the clinical setting or research focus, ethical decision-making challenges nurses to decide among personal values, emotional response, and principles set forth by professional guidelines. Ulrich describes multiple occasions when nurses speak for the rights of persons throughout the lifespan. Her expertise is notable as it stems from her academic experiences in nursing and medicine.

Nursing Ethics in Everyday Practice is a compilation of thirteen chapters each generating thought provoking statements to consider as one studies the case presentations in tandem with supporting discussions. One might think that ethical codes provide a pathway to resolve a situation, however clarity during a situation becomes complicated when searching for truth compared to loyalty, goal setting, individuals or community and mercy as opposed to justice. Several frameworks endeavor to address mental health and competency and how to objectively examine a given case providing the necessary measures necessary to apply a model satisfactorily. Reflection is essential to understand who you are, who you want to be and what values define you in order to be successful in applying ethics in practice.

Ulrich outlines environmental complexities of patients' rights and presents challenges to the decision-making process; she provides systematic approaches to construct realistic action plans. Each step is a tool that affords a reflective stance on personal communication and development of competency.

Nursing Ethics in Everyday Practice provides profound insight pertaining to ethical consultation. Throughout this chapter are multiple supporting agencies, namely The Joint Commission and the American Nurses Credentialing Center that recognize the implications and rights for health care.
