DEFINITION

Social responsibility refers to the ethical framework suggesting that individuals or organizations, have an obligation to act for the benefit of society at large. It emphasizes acting in ways that have a positive impact on society while minimizing negative impacts.

- **Sustainable Business Practices:** A company adopts eco-friendly manufacturing processes to reduce environmental harm.
- **Ethical Investing:** An investor invests in companies that adhere to ethical standards and promote positive social change.
